## RECORDER

The City Recorder is the Election Officer for the municipality.

The election officer coordinates and conducts municipal elections for the city of Vineyard.

What is an election? The Encyclopedia Britannica defines an election as: the formal process of selecting a person for public office or of accepting or rejecting a political proposition by voting.

### THE ELECTION OFFICER'S DUTIES ARE TO:

- Administer all functions related to candidate filing. This year the filing period is August 10 – 17.
- Administer all functions related to financial disclosure required by state code and/or city code.
- Publish Public Notices required by law. The city may work with the Utah County Elections Division to publish notices jointly with other jurisdictions.
- Accept responsibility to keep candidates and the public up to date on all legal requirements governing candidates and campaigns.
- Educate the public on the election process.
- Thoroughly examine and proofread all

election programming. Approve content and formatting of ballots to be mailed to registered voters.

- Post on the City web site the official reported results of the election.
- Prepare and present the final election results for canvassing. "Canvass" in this context means that the mayor and city council, in an open and public meeting, carefully examine the election results and declare the winner(s). Because Vineyard contracts with Utah County Elections Division, they are responsible for following election duties:
  - Ballot design, printing, and mailing
  - Process voted ballots
  - Program and test voting equipment
  - Poll worker recruitment, training, and compensation
  - Tabulate and report election results on the Utah County Website
  - Provisional ballot verification
  - Conduct recounts (as needed)
  - Provide final canvass report of official election results.

By voting, you have a say in what your elected officials are doing. Ballots will be mailed out starting October 12th, so make sure you are registered to vote in Vineyard by going to [vote.utah.gov](http://vote.utah.gov). The election ends at 8:00 PM on November 2.

## "THE LORD WAS MERCIFUL"

Sickness and disease took a heavy toll on early residents of Vineyard. The Larsen/Gammon family history recalls one couple whose children were devastated by scarlet fever. The oldest died on Oct. 5, 1903; a few days later their beloved daughter died. Two other sons, Clarence and Leland, survived the disease. "...we cannot describe our grief, but the Lord was merciful in sparing us two other boys," they said. Because they were under quarantine, the surviving family members could not attend the funerals.

# WASTE BEST PRACTICES

With summertime weather comes the mowing season. It is important to remember not to blow grass clippings into the street. Grass clippings in the street ultimately end up in a storm drain where they can clog storm drains and cause drainage and flooding issues by clogging curb inlets and pipes. This can cause water to back up and flood within the drainage system or the creek.

Why are grass clippings and leaf litter harmful? When yard waste is discarded within the stormwater drainage system, it will decompose. Decomposing yard waste can supercharge the creek with nutrients such as nitrogen and phosphorus, causing toxic algae blooms.

Sediment (soil, dirt) is the number one stormwater pollutant. It carries excess nutrients from fertilizers, grass clippings, antifreeze and oil from leaking vehicles, and pet waste into Utah Lake, harming fish and aquatic life.

- If a holiday (only those shown above on calendar) falls on a weekday, service will be delayed one day following the holiday.
- Recycle containers that have trash in them will **NOT** be dumped as recycling and called into the city.
- All containers **MUST** be placed outside by **7 a.m.**
- Containers should be placed in the street with the wheels against the curb or within 2 feet of blacktop with the front of the container facing the street.
- The container must be placed **4 feet** apart from other containers and 8 feet from mailboxes, poles, fences, trees, or parked vehicles for easy access.
