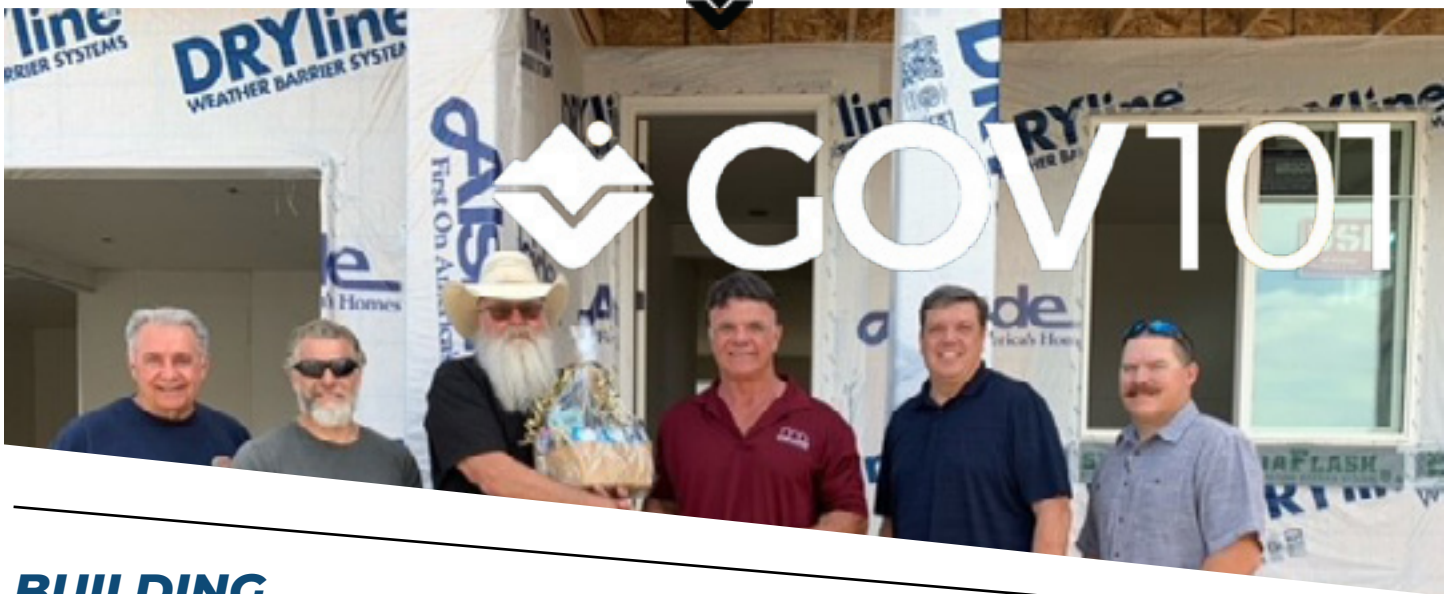

## **BUILDING**

Thinking of finishing your basement? First thing you need to know is that a Building Permit is required in to finish your basement.

The staff in the Vineyard Building Department is available to help you through the process and answer your questions along the way.

What are the benefits of having a building permit? First and foremost a permit will ensure that your basement is built to code compliance and it will protect your family's health and welfare. Faulty wiring and electrical failures are the second leading factors to a fire starting in your home.

Having a code compliant basement finish may help you with any insurance claims should any mishaps take place in the future of your home. Selling your home with remodel work that was done without a permit may be tricky as some banks won't lend and buyers may be wary to purchase your home. Finishing your basement with a permit will also help your house sell for the full appraisal value.

Thinking about utilizing your basement as an accessory dwelling unit or home occupation? This can only be done legally in a basement that has been finished with a building permit.

Don't want to do the work twice? Be aware that getting a basement, that was finished without a permit, permitted and code compliant requires that the finish work, drywall and insulation be removed in order for our inspectors to see the work that was done. So, it is more cost effective in the long run to pull your permit before you start your basement finish.

You may be under the misconception that if you pull a permit you have to hire a general contractor. You can still finish your basement as an owner and you only need a general contractor if you want one.

The typical cost for a building permit to finish your basement is approximately \$300.

The 2021 Municipal Election will be held on Tuesday, November 2. Please check the [Vineyard website](#) or the [state website](#) for candidate information to help you make an informed choice.

Have you registered to vote? Have you checked your voter registration lately to update your address? If not, please visit the state website at [Vote.utah.gov](http://Vote.utah.gov).

Important information for voters:

- Ballots will be mailed out on October 12th. If you have not received your ballot by October 19th, contact the Utah County Elections Division at 801-851-8128.
- You may drop off your ballot at the ballot drop box in the Vineyard City office parking lot, or at any ballot drop box in the county, any time until 8:00 pm on Election Day.
- If you mail your ballot, you MUST have it postmarked by Monday, November 1st.
- Before Election Day, if you need assistance with your ballot, call the Utah County Elections Division at 801-851-8128. • On Election Day, if you need assistance with your ballot, go to any Vote Center in the county between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm.

- If a holiday (only those shown above on calendar) falls on a weekday, service will be delayed one day following the holiday.
- Recycle containers that have trash in them will **NOT** be dumped as recycling and called into the city.
- All containers **MUST** be placed outside by **7 a.m.**
- Containers should be placed in the street with the wheels against the curb or within 2 feet of blacktop with the front of the container facing the street.
- The container must be placed **4 feet** apart from other containers and 8 feet from mailboxes, poles, fences, trees, or parked vehicles for easy access.
